**Title:** Youth Educator

**Reports to:** Prevention Manager

**Classification:** Full-time, with full benefits

**Summary** Shalom Bayit seeks a dynamic Youth Educator to join our team. The Youth Educator will facilitate healthy relationships education, consent and dating violence prevention workshops for Jewish youth, educators, and parents through our *Love Shouldn't Hurt* teen dating violence prevention program. Position also includes outreach and collaboration with Jewish youth-serving organizations, youth leadership development and supervision of interns, and assisting the Prevention team to develop curriculum content, training, and coordinated promotion of Shalom Bayit's mission to end gender-based violence.

### **Salary & Benefits**

### **Responsibilities**

- Facilitate workshops on dating violence, healthy relationships, consent, and boundaries to Jewish youth (elementary through college age) as well as companion workshops for parents and educators
- Conduct and coordinate outreach to Jewish youth groups, schools, synagogues, and camps, in collaboration with Prevention Manager and the prevention team
- Recruit, supervise, and provide youth leadership and mentoring to youth education interns
- Maintain accurate, up-to-date program statistics, records, and evaluation
- Manage the *Love Shouldn't Hurt* social media
- Perform all duties necessary to the function of Shalom Bayit programs, including but not limited to:
  - Collaborating with team to ensure smooth running of agency office and programs
  - Contributing to annual event production, including but not limited to youth-related programming
  - Participating in agency planning; attending staff meetings, trainings, and agency events

### **Qualifications**

- Knowledge of Bay Area Jewish community and/or other Jewish communal experience
- Experience working with youth and/or background in consent education and abuse prevention
- At least one-year professional public speaking or workshop facilitation experience
- BA in a related field or equivalent experience
- 40-hour domestic violence advocate training (can be completed after hire)
- Commitment to agency philosophy, mission, and vision

**Skills:** The ideal candidate possesses

- Natural talent and ability to work effectively with young people
- Ability to establish and maintain positive relationships with both coworkers and diverse populations in the community, including a wide range of cultural and religious beliefs, class backgrounds, sexual and gender orientations, ages, abilities, and learning styles
- Effective oral, written, and interpersonal communication skills
- Self-motivation and ability to plan, prioritize and organize workload
- Ability to work independently and as part of a team
- Desire to work in a small, grassroots environment dedicated to empowering women and girls
- Personal qualifications of responsibility, sensitivity, flexibility, initiative and insight
- Commitment to and understanding of social change approaches to ending violence
